Vision

My vision for my 6th grade class this year is to provide my students with the necessary tools to be leaders of their future. Our Big Goal will be 85% mastery on the Louisiana iLEAP test in order to open doors to opportunities that will not otherwise be available. We will become advocates for our own education by 1) understand the power within ourselves, 2) taking ownership of our actions, 3) achieve plausible academic outcomes, and 4) are consistent with my student’s desires.

We will work as a team to ensure that all students are supported in their academic achievement. Our voices and concerns will be heard in a safe classroom environment. Within Jefferson Parish, a mere 67% of students graduating each year it is with great urgency that students are given the education they deserve. Every single child that walks through our door this fall can, and will receive the academic skills to triumph in the classroom. We will remain persistent and determined in the midst of challenges, be awareness of collegiate options, and will incorporate their personal interest within daily assignments and lessons. We will become passionate about our education and understand the importance of Read 180 and ELA to our personal success as a student.

Leaders of Tomorrow's 5 Goals for Success

1. **Leadership** - we will learn to be leaders for positive change in their own lives and in the community
2. **Conflict Management** - we will support one another with a multitude of issues accompanying adolescence including; maintaining a safe space for all students, personal decision making, classroom concerns, academic motivation, peer and friendship concerns.
3. **Understanding of Self** – we will be able to understand that Black people we are not a mono-culture the black experience is different for every single one of us. Through understanding the richness and history of ourselves we can better determine our future as holistic human beings. We will also challenge and change the stereotypes that are placed upon us as individuals and as an entire people.
4. **Creative Expression** - we will be invested in creative ways to engage in academics (reading library, personal journaling and reflection corner to release frustration)
5. **Teamwork** – we will internalize that we are a family, a community and a team; our success as an individual is a success for all (we will get our “shine on,” engage in daily shoutouts, and Friday Umoja circles)

The first goal toward our year-long vision is the ability to develop of leadership skills inside and outside the classroom. We believe that strong students understand how knowledge and information are constructed in our world. As leaders, we use their minds well in order to navigate our complex world of information. We are committed to graduating students who have the tools, knowledge and experiences to be self-sufficient and empowered life-long learners. We know that to be successful in the classroom we must effectively work and lead in groups, families, and communities by actively demonstrating respect and accountability to others and their differences. The sad reality for many students is they are unaware of the gravity of their situation within this educational catastrophe. We must be empowered by our leadership skills and use this ability to articulate our truth, instead of being crippled by our reality.

Our second goal is to be able to deal with our differences in a positive and respectful manner. Within American culture, we have been conditioned to inflict violence on one another and accept this as a tolerable means of confronting our issues. We will understand that words are one of most powerful tools we have as leaders. We have to always be mindful of how we communicate to one another. “You can catch more bee’s with honey than with vinegar,” this is a quote that I will repeat within our classroom to reinforce the notion that words are potent. This will support my students intrinsically internalizing the power of appropriate conflict management. Over the year we understand the power of our words, power of our voice, power of our appearance, power of education, power of the music we listen to, power of the food we eat, the true power of ourselves. We will learn to agree to disagree, and that people do not always have to valid our individual opinions. In middle school is can be very challenging to keep small problems small problems, but we learn the skills to properly deal with minor situations. We will incorporate a no nonsense nurturer position by not allowing bullying, teasing or unruly attitudes control the classroom.

The third goal is understanding people of African decent. We will care deeply for Black people and hope that we find and take hold of the tools that will grant us our freedom. Our ancestors have fought relentlessly on our behalf to ensure that we blessed with a life free of discrimination, prejudice, and biases. We as a community have lost sight of our history causing us to be blinded by our future. We are become immune to settling for MUCH less than we deserve. We will know that with positive reinforcement and unconditional support all students black, brown, white and in between are more than worthy of an exceptional education and can learn. African Americans have forever been given the short end of the stick. We have misplaced our resilience and perseverance, and are now more than ever willing to settle with inadequacies. This has become a habit and mindset that is crucial to the limitation of our education growth and development. We will be passionate about speaking, living and knowing the truth. We will be passionate about the holistic empowerment of ourselves as students. We will passionate about learning to love themselves, where we come from and where we are going. Another challenge we will be charged with is, understanding Blackness and it’s connection to the English language. We will dare to explore the English language, develop our vocabulary and be able to navigate the world and create the possibilities we often dream. Our ideas of blackness are created by the movies, television

shows, and the reality where we live. We will expand our minds to know about Black engineers, poets, nurses, superintendents, stockbrokers, and millionaires.

Forth goal we will work on throughout the year is the influence of creativity within the classroom. Through understanding my students interest and aspirations I will better equip to engage them with Read 180 and ELA concepts and expectations. We must incorporate this within my classroom to support students that are already facing reading, writing, and comprehension difficulties. The ability for us to use art to support our academic achievement is essential. For us to have a clear understanding of self, to be leaders, and problem solve we must find expressive outlets. This will support my students enrolled in System 44, for complete non-readers, because language competency maybe be overwhelming. Artistic expression will support our classroom to make sure that all of my student's actions contribute to the curriculum and student learning.

My last goal is that teamwork is most important skill that we will work on this year. Many are deprived of the truth and stuck in a state of arrested development. Often times society dictates your ability to learn, grow, and rise from struggle based on other people. This method of dictating students capacities is detrimental not only to individual, but to the entire future of our nation. Students have the capacity to do more than they know. As human beings, we often get discouraged by obstacles that may arise in the process. I believe that if students are given the proper tools to reach their full potential magical things can happen. As a team, we will have and maintain high expectations. We will be invested, excited and engaged about our education. We will model teamwork by example. We will be able to work together to ensure that we maintain a healthy learning environment. We are, because I am. We can do very few things alone. I want my student to know they are their classmates keeper, for us to flourish, prosper and be successful we must work together.
